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
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GIVE GET OPPORTUNITIES

This week flew by even faster than the last. The children spent this week acclimating to their new schedule and learning how to use their work plan to successfully map out their days. In preparation for **Rosh Hashanah** we discussed the concept of "the king in the field" during the month of Elul as well as learning about the different symbols (simanim) that we may find on our Rosh Hashanah tables. We discussed the shofar, its purpose, and what sounds are made.

In math and language we are reviewing old concepts, and learning how to use the manipulative to figure out what the different operations mean. Some friends are working on their one to one correspondence and learning number sequencing while others are working on addition, subtraction and multiplication. Friends are learning to write words, blend, read small books and read more quickly.

In Parsha, we learned about the Mitzvos of wearing Tzitzis, returning lost objects, and putting a fence on your roof if it is accessible. The 3rd and 4th graders reviewed some Gematria (numerical value), to help understand how "Tzitzis" reminds us of the Mitzvos.

We had our first birthday celebration of the **Year...** Happy birthday Rikki! It was beautiful to hear all the nice things friends had to say about who Rikki is and what she contributes to our community. We all got to work on an "owl about me" poster that we then took home.

We started working toward our community building jar project. We earn beads as a community to work together toward a goal we would like to attain. When we fill our jar, we will vote on the activity we would like to do together. The children are excited at the prospect of choosing something extra, fun to do together.

We welcome our newest friend, Meir into our classroom.
